

Beulah Camp Policies

Beulah Camp is a Christian camp owned and operated by the Atlantic District of The Wesleyan Church. Basic Christian conduct in matters of relationships, morals, integrity, and cooperative spirit is expected from all present. As a further guide, we require that all cottagers, campers, and persons on the grounds respect the following policies:

- 1. It is important to respect the privacy and comfort of others on the grounds. Therefore, quiet is to be maintained throughout the grounds after 12 midnight.
- 2. The use/possession of alcoholic beverages, tobacco, and non -medicinal drugs is prohibited.
- 3. During scheduled Sunday services at the Tabernacle, all recreational areas will be closed.
- 4. We encourage modest apparel on the grounds and bathing areas at all times. We further require that an adequate covering be worn by those going to and from the beach or wharf.
- Those launching boats from the beach must exercise great care and caution in doing so, and are requested to move their trucks/trailers away from the beach area to allow others the courtesy of access to the water. No parking on the beach.
- 6. Only those eligible to be licensed drivers are permitted to operate motorized vehicles on the grounds, golf carts included. Motorists are required to drive according to the posted limits, and with caution.
- 7. Toilet tissue is the only paper product to be placed in toilets

 no feminine products or diapers! These items cause serious problems to the system and could result in complete breakdown. This applies camp-wide, no exceptions!
- 8. Personal use of fireworks is prohibited.
- 9. Animals are not permitted in any Camp & Conference Centre building, or on the beach (Department of Health directive). When dogs are not confined within a cottage or trailer, leashes are always required; owners are expected to clean up after their pets.
- 10. Advanced approval is required when more than two dogs are housed on one lot at any time. At the discretion of Beulah Camp leadership, dogs may be required to wear a bark collar. Dog owners may be required to remove their dogs from the grounds upon written notice should safety concerns or excessive noise persist.

General Information

Camp Bell: when you hear that camp bell ringing, it is your 'call to worship' - a five minute reminder that a worship service is beginning in the tabernacle.

<u>Canteen</u>: We are not operating a canteen this year, although Beulah Camp will have pop, chips, and candy bars available for purchase—cash only. This is separate from the refreshments (muffins, cookies, fruit) we will have available in the evenings.

<u>Keys</u>: If you signed out keys, please return to Bonnie Eadle before you leave.

Meals: will all be served in the dining hall and everyone is asked to allow parents with small children and anyone needing assistance to go first. If you do require help, please be seated at your table and your helper can come to the side door of the kitchen to get your meal.

Name Tags: Members of the MCF 2023 Committee have yellow name tags; please see them with any questions. A 'Kid-Friendly' yellow star on name tags identifies safe children's ministry volunteers.

Offering: Offering will only be collected one time, which will be during the Sunday morning Worship Service. Cheques can be made out to 'Maritime Christian Fellowship', and envelopes are available at the chapel. We also accept e-transfers, at mcf.beulah@gmail.com. The account is set up for automatic deposit, so there is no need for a password.

Children's & Youth Programs, continued

Parents of children in the Nursery and Elementary programs must accompany their children to the designated site for their child's age group and sign them in, but will have enough time to make it back to the tabernacle before the message begins.

Promptly following the message, parents of all children, regardless of age, must pick up and sign out their children. For safety reasons, volunteers working with the children's program cannot dismiss your children; they must be picked up.

<u>Please Note</u>: Volunteers have been asked to plan for 45 minutes of programming, but if the service is going longer than expected, please be mindful of the time and pick up your children.

Youth Program

Teens in Grades 6-12 will join in worship in the Tabernacle and then leave for their programming (Friday and Saturday) with Richard Jones and Mark Ketch. Teens meet in the room above the Dining Hall. They will remain in the Tabernacle for the entire service Sunday.
